7:10 **Portland Advisory Bodies Program**

Lead: Ocean Eale, Advisory Bodies Analyst - Office of Community & Civic Life

Background: The Office of Community & Civic Life oversees Portland's Advisory Bodies Program, which supports 87 advisory bodies. These bodies consist of Portlanders who volunteer to provide insights on City projects, policies, and practices. The program offers trainings, resources, and manages recruitment for these advisory bodies.

Status: The Advisory Bodies Program is conducting an inventory of all advisory bodies to provide accurate information to the new Engagement Officer and the 12 new City Councilors. The program is testing a new application process to streamline recruitment. In 2024, the program managed 399 applications to fill 110 vacancies, with the Bicycle Advisory Committee, Portland Advisory Committee on Housing, and Golf Advisory Committee being the most popular.

Purpose: Increase awareness among district coalitions and neighborhood associations about how the Advisory Bodies Program enhances community engagement and ensures diverse representation in City advisory programs. The goal is to explore opportunities, strengthen community, and encourage participation in advisory bodies.

7:40 **Establishing District Priorities for District 3**

Lead: Nanci Champlin, Executive Director - SE Uplift Neighborhood Coalition

Background: Portland is undergoing significant changes to its government structure. The commission for of government is being phased out, leading to new roles and responsibilities for elected officials. Starting in January 2025, a 12-member city council will represent four geographic districts, with District 3 having three city council representatives. City councilors will work to address issues facing your community and advocate for budget allocations to resolve them.

Status: As the new government structure takes shape, it is crucial for District 3 to identify and communicate shared priorities on policies, programs, and even projects. This will ensure that the district needs and goals are effectively addressed by the new city council.



Purpose: To gather and prioritize input from District 3 collaborators on key policies, programs, and policies. Input will inform a list that is shared with city council.
